ORDER

The commission reviewed the complaint and relevant court records, and concluded that a ruling on a motion the complainant filed was inadvertently delayed, in part, because the complainant filed multiple pleadings in various cases in the same court. The court clerk erroneously placed the motion in the wrong case file. The judge promptly ruled on the motion when the problem was brought to his attention. Given the circumstances, the commission found no ethical misconduct on the part of the judge. It dismissed the complaint and advised the judge to implement procedures to avoid delays in high volume cases.

The complaint is dismissed pursuant to Rules 16(a) and 23(a).
