ORDER

The complainant alleged that a justice of the peace improperly refused to waive a traffic fine. The commission reviewed the complaint and found no evidence of ethical misconduct on the part of the judge. Whether or not the judge should have granted the request to waive the fine is a legal issue outside the jurisdiction of the commission. Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed in its entirety pursuant to Rules 16(a) and 23.

On June 20, 2011, I appeared before Judge for
traffic violation. I plead guilty and was assessed fines of \$2743.
The court agreed to payment plan of 100.00 per month.
At this time I requested ABSTRACTS be released so as to
reinstate my license. Judge denied request stating fines
to be paid in full before releasing ABSTRACTS.
I had hoped to be able to pay these fines in full within
prior to the new school year. I cannot do so.

I sent a request, via fax, to Judge on July 27, 2011
(See attached) pleading for leniency in my circumstances. As of
today, Aug 3, 2011, I was informed Judge denied my request.

It is my understanding there is NO LAW stating fines HAVE to
be paid in full. It is at the SOLE Discretion of the Judge.

For the reasons outlined in my request, I urgently need driving
privileges reinstated. In Judge decision in denying
this request, he is essentially violating my children's
AZ Constitutional right, Article 11, & New Ordinance 2.4,
Establishment of Natural Rights. In addition to amounting to
Cruel + unusual punishment.

Convicted Felons are offered restricted licenses so they
can continue to work. My offenses are misdemeanors. Where
is the fair + justice in this?

I have contacted City Manager of Maricopa, Brenda Fisher. In
addition, I will contact the Governor's office and any other
relevant individual or entity, in airing this absurdity.
