The Complainant alleged a superior court judge entered an unlawful decree and that the court lost his exhibits due to corruption.

The role of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine whether a judicial officer has engaged in conduct that violates the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct or Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution. There must be clear and convincing evidence of such a violation in order for the Commission to take disciplinary action against a judicial officer.

The Commission does not have jurisdiction to overturn, amend, or remand a judicial officer's legal rulings. The Commission reviewed all relevant available information and concluded there was not clear and convincing evidence of ethical misconduct in this matter. The complaint is therefore dismissed pursuant to Commission Rules 16(a) and 23(a).

Commission member Denise K. Aguilar did not participate in the consideration of this matter.

There is evidence that documents and files were lost as a result of a scandal in the County courts. An investigation of the clerks of the court, by _____ the _____ of the court in Arizona found that there was corruption, payoffs, to the the clerks in return for false documents being sent out from the court ,to individuals involved, in court actions. It is important to not that these illegal actions were brought, to light in the same time frame as my court case
