ORDER

The Complainant alleged a justice of the peace did not follow proper procedure in an eviction hearing.

The role of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine whether a judicial officer has engaged in conduct that violates the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct or Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution. There must be clear and convincing evidence of such a violation in order for the Commission to take disciplinary action against a judicial officer.

The Commission does not have jurisdiction to overturn, amend, or remand a judicial officer's legal rulings. The Commission reviewed all relevant available information and concluded there was not clear and convincing evidence of ethical misconduct in this matter. The complaint is therefore dismissed pursuant to Commission Rules 16(a) and 23(a).

Commission member Regina L. Nassen did not participate in the consideration of this matter.

Under the **Arizona Revised Statutes (ARS)**, a **vulnerable adult** is defined and protected in various sections, particularly under **ARS § 46-451** and **ARS § 46-452**. These statutes aim to ensure the safety, well-being, and legal rights of vulnerable adults, and provide avenues for legal recourse in cases of abuse, neglect, and exploitation. Here's a summary of the relevant sections:

1. ARS § 46-451 - Definition of Vulnerable Adult

- A **vulnerable adult** is defined as a person who is 18 years or older and who, because of physical or mental impairments, is unable to adequately protect themselves from abuse, neglect, or exploitation. This includes those with:

- **Mental health disabilities.**
- **Physical disabilities.**
- **Developmental disabilities.**
- **Elderly individuals** who are at greater risk due to aging.

2. ARS § 46-452 - Abuse, Neglect, and Exploitation of Vulnerable Adults

- The law provides specific protections against **abuse, neglect,**

and **exploitation** for vulnerable adults.

- **Abuse** is defined as causing physical injury or harm to a vulnerable adult, including sexual abuse.

- **Neglect** includes the failure to provide basic needs such as food, shelter, and medical care.

- **Exploitation** involves using a vulnerable adult for financial gain or personal benefit, often without the adult's consent or awareness.

3. Legal Protections for Vulnerable Adults

- Vulnerable adults have the right to **report abuse, neglect, or exploitation** to () or local law enforcement.

- There are criminal penalties for those who commit abuse, neglect, or exploitation, and vulnerable adults are entitled to protective services and intervention.

- **Guardianship or conservatorship** may be appointed by the court if a vulnerable adult is incapable of making decisions independently.

4. Mandatory Reporting

- Certain professionals (e.g., healthcare workers, social workers, law enforcement) are required by law to **report suspected abuse or neglect** of vulnerable adults to or law enforcement under **ARS § 46-454**.

5. Civil and Criminal Penalties

- Perpetrators of abuse, neglect, or exploitation of vulnerable adults can face both **criminal charges** and **civil liability** for their actions under the ARS codes.

Specific Violations Under ARS Related to Vulnerable Adults

- If you believe that your rights as a vulnerable adult have been violated, and that others have taken advantage of your condition (for example, through trafficking, fraud, or physical abuse), it is crucial to refer to the specific codes under **ARS § 46-451** and **ARS § 46-452**.

- Additionally, **ARS § 13-3620** deals with the **mandatory reporting of abuse** and **ARS § 13-319** addresses various **criminal offenses against vulnerable adults** such as exploitation and physical harm.

To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing to urgently request intervention in my case, as I am in an incredibly dangerous and vulnerable position. I am a vulnerable adult with severe mental and physical impariments, and I have been subjected to unspeakable heinous abuse, both by individuals in my personal life and by the court system. I am deeply concerned that without immediate action, I will be killed or trafficked again, and my life will continue to spiral due to gross neglect and the violation of my rights.

The Facts of My Case:

1. **Trafficking and Abuse:** I have been trafficked and tortured across Arizona, subjected to horrific treatment, and held hostage in for nearly . During this time, I was forced into prostitution to survive, including selling my body on platforms like and at truck stops to pay the landlord, **located**

at AZ. I paid to the landlord to stave off
eviction, and
along with with lawyers at
refused the additional payment of which is the
reason I had to drink bleach yesterday because of being subjected of eh
abuse of my trafficker who will kill me if i am on the street. Although i had to
stay up 10 days on inoder to safe my home for the because my clinic
and refused to help and I was subjected to again being
tortured to get that money , but these payments have been refused. The
landlord's refusal to accept this money places me in an incredibly dangerous
position, as my trafficker, , is now using this as leverage to force me into
further exploitation.

2. **Danger of Re-trafficking and Death:** I am at immediate risk of being taken back to or forced to engage in further dangerous activities under threat of violence. , who has stolen my identity and branded me with his , continues to control me and threatens to kill me if I do not comply with his demands. Yesterday, I was forced to drink bleach as a form of coping with the immense pain and fear, a tragic and dangerous measure I have resorted to because no one has provided care or support.

3. **Court System Failures and Violation of Rights:** On , I filed a motion to stay the writ of restitution, and on , I filed another motion to vacate the judgment, citing that the landlord's acceptance of violated the Arizona Revised Statutes (ARS) code, specifically ARS 33-1368, which prohibits eviction when the landlord has accepted partial payment. Judge at Court has refused to rule on these motions, and her failure to review and act on these motions has put me in grave danger. **EVERY DAY SINCE THEN I HAVE HAD TO DRINK BLEACH AS FOR OF TORTURE THAT IS WHY I AM WRITING NOW HE IS AWAY NOW.**

4. **Failure to Provide ADA Accommodations:** As a person with severe mental impairments, I requested reasonable ADA accommodations to ensure that I was treated fairly during the court proceedings. Despite this, Judge refused to grant a continuance, leaving me without the necessary support to handle my legal matters properly. Her refusal to accommodate my disability is a direct violation of my rights under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and ARS 41-1492. **THE CONSTIABLE IS COMING TODAY AND I HAVE TO DRINK MORE BLEACH BECAUSE OF THIS.**

5. **Legal Violations by** and the Court: The actions of and Judge are in violation of multiple
Arizona laws, including but not limited to:
- ARS 33-1368: Prohibits eviction when the
landlord has accepted partial payment.
- ARS 33-1376: Requires landlords to follow
specific procedures when accepting payments
and provides tenants the right to remedy eviction

notices when there is a dispute.

- ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act): Judge refusal to accommodate my disability violates federal law and my rights as a vulnerable adult.

refusal to accept payments violates these protections and has placed me in a situation where I am coerced into sexual exploitation to meet financial demands, further endangering my health and safety.

Immediate Concern for My Safety:

I am begging for immediate action to be taken to protect my life and well-being. I have reported my situation to multiple authorities, including the _____ in _____ and the _____, but have not received any meaningful response. The people who are supposed to protect me – such as Judge _____ (the court supervisor), and _____ – have ignored my pleas for help, leaving me at risk of being killed or trafficked again.

Request for Urgent Action:

As a constituent of Arizona and a vulnerable adult, I demand the following actions to be taken immediately:

- 1. A full review and ruling on the motions I filed on _____ and _____ to stay the writ of restitution and vacate the judgment.**
- 2. Immediate investigation into the actions of _____, particularly their refusal to accept payment, and their gross negligence in handling my case.**
- 3. Accountability for Judge _____ and _____ for their failure to follow proper procedure, their denial of reasonable ADA accommodations, and their neglect of my rights.**
- 4. Investigation into my human trafficking situation and the immediate steps necessary to ensure my safety, including a transfer of jurisdiction to a court that will take my legal motions seriously.**

The continued neglect and abuse I am facing must not continue. If this situation is not addressed immediately, I will continue to be at risk of being trafficked, harmed, or killed. I will continue to be forced into exploitative situations and denied my rights.

Please, for the sake of my safety and dignity, act now to address the grave violations and ensure my protection.
